

Congregational Meeting



This **Sunday, March 26,** we will have a **10 a.m. Combined Worship Service** followed by an **11 a.m. Congregational Meeting.**

The Church Council has proposed a formal vote on whether or not to join the Global Methodist Church. So, after a short time of discussion with a question and answer period, the Church Council will make a formal motion to take a congregational vote.

We will vote by **written paper ballot**. You will simply mark either: 1) Yes, I want to join the Global Methodist Church, or 2) No, I don't want to join the Global Methodist Church.

The Church Council has established that a **simple majority** is required for the vote to pass.

The Global Methodist Church: Our Witness to the World



Ethics & Morality. For every church our theological beliefs will sooner or later affect our ethics and morality. That is, what we believe eventually comes out in how we live with others, either socially or politically. Our morality affects the laws we make, how we vote in elections, even how we treat our friends and neighbors.

So, before we join the Global Methodist Church, we need to ask: How do they interpret the morality and ethics of the Bible? What social and political commitments have they made?

The following is a brief summary of their moral and ethical witness to the world:

- Every person is made in the Image of God. So, each person should be treated with respect, dignity, and justice.
- Life is sacred. So, the Global Methodist Church stands against abortion and euthanasia.
- Workers ought to have safe working conditions and fair compensation.
- The Bible calls us to care for the poor, personally and collectively.
- There are only two genders: Male and Female.
- Marriage is between one man and one woman to the exclusion of all others. And human sexuality is a gift from God to be enjoyed only in godly marriage.
- So, the Global Methodist Church stands against same-sex unions, polygamy, polyamory, and transgenderism.
- The GMC also opposes all sexual unfaithfulness and immorality, such as promiscuity, pornography, and human trafficking.
- The Global Methodist Church believes every child should be properly loved, protected, and cared for. So, the GMC stands against all child abuse and exploitation.
- In the Bible, God told the Israelites to respect and care for the foreigner. So, the Global Methodist Church supports properly managed immigration.
- The Global Methodist Church supports freedom of religion. Every person should be free to pursue their faith in God without interference from the government.

These are some of the major moral and ethical commitments of the Global Methodist Church.

At its heart the Global Methodist Church is the best of what we have known from the Methodist Church and the United Methodist Church. In that sense, it will be the most familiar to us of all the Methodist / Wesleyan denominations. Most of what they have changed are the things we all tend to agree needed to be changed. And one of the advantages of joining now is that our voice as a congregation will be heard locally in the new Mississippi Conference of the Global Methodist Church as well as at the General Conference that will convene in summer or fall of 2024.

I hope you will prayerfully consider how God might be leading us to become a part of the Global Methodist Church.
