

The Lion and the Lamb

This past Sunday we were unable to livestream the worship service since we were in the Chapel. So, I thought I'd share a brief summary of our Scripture from Sunday.

"Then I saw a Lamb, looking as if it had been slain, standing in the center of the throne, encircled by the four living creatures and the elders. He had seven horns and seven eyes, which are the seven spirits of God sent out into all the earth. He came and took the scroll from the right hand of Him who sat on the throne." Revelation 5:6-7

Starting in chapter 4, John sees a vision of the God Almighty on the throne of glory in all His majesty and splendor. And all of heaven bows down to worship and adore Him, singing "Holy, Holy, Holy!"

And in His right hand God holds a scroll that's been sealed with seven seals so that no one can open it. And John weeps because no one is found who is worthy to open the scroll and read the Word of God for them. Finally, one of the elders consoles him: "Do not weep! Behold, the Lion of the tribe of Judah, the Root of David, has triumphed. He is able to open the scroll and its seven seals." (Rev. 5:5)

And John looks up expecting to see this powerful, roaring lion stride forth to claim the scroll and read it. Only, what he sees instead is a little lamb. Worse yet, the lamb looks as if it had been slain. The lamb looks like one of those lambs sacrificed on the altar for the forgiveness of sins or for the Passover feast.

John expects to see this roaring lion come like a mighty King. And instead, what he sees is a bloodstained Lamb coming in meek and mild.

In essence, the great Lion of Judah who has triumphed and gained the victory is the Bloodstained Lamb who was slain on Calvary. Jesus, our Crucified Lord, is the King who sits on the throne of glory. And He alone is worthy to take the scroll, break the seals, and read God's Word.

The Cross is God's victory over sin and death and the devil. Though the devil doesn't know it yet, he has already lost. The victory was won on Calvary. The war is over. Only the final battle remains. And the outcome is certain. Jesus has won. Not by sword or spear or battle, but by His shed blood on the Cross for you and me.

What the world views as weakness is God's glory. Love, mercy, forgiveness. Sacrifice, humility, compassion. These look like weakness to the world. But they are God's glory and our great strength. As God told Paul in 2 Corinthians 12:9: "My grace is sufficient for you. For my power is made perfect in weakness."

That's so often how God works. He takes what looks like weakness to the world, and He perfects it for His glory. He takes what looks like losing, and He uses it to seal the victory over sin and death. And nowhere is that clearer than Jesus' death on the Cross.

Jesus gave His life out of love for you and me. He sacrificed all for the forgiveness of our sin. And what looks like defeat becomes God's victory over sin and the devil.

Take heart, the devil has lost. That's the point of Revelation. Things will get worse before they get better. Dark days are still ahead. But the devil is defeated. Jesus has won. And the Lamb who was slain sits upon the throne of glory, and all of heaven and earth bow down to worship and adore Him. For, worthy is the Lamb who was slain to receive honor and glory and praise!
